STEELHEAD TRIPS

□ Rain Jacket.

I prefer six and seven weight Spey rods that are 12-14' but a 13' 7 weight is a do it all Spey rod.

WHAT I BRING: ☐ My rods are dedicated for floating line or Skagit, they are rigged, and ready to go. ☐ Dedicated Floating Scandi line rod - 6133 Winston. ☐ Dedicated Skagit rod - 7133 Winston. ☐ Beginner rods - Orvis Clearwaters, 7130. *NOTE: Rental waders and boots are available for \$50. WHAT YOU SHOULD BRING: ☐ A floating line rod and reel. □ Layering jacket. ☐ A Skagit rod and reel. □ Layering fleece pants. □ Some Steelhead flies. ☐ Warm socks and gloves. ☐ Leaders. ☐ A hat to keep you warm. ☐ Asst. of Sink tips. ☐ A hat for sun protection. ☐ Some tippet. ☐ Polarized glasses. □ Nippers. ☐ Sunscreen. ☐ Chest waders. ☐ Chapstick. ☐ Wading Boots w/Studded Felt ☐ A day/dry bag for storage. Soles. ☐ Snacks. ☐ A wading staff. ☐ A reusable water bottle.

LET'S MAXIMIZE YOUR TIME ON THE WATER.

To start the day your rods should be strung with a floating line and fly and ready to go when we meet in the morning. If you have a dedicated Skagit rod please bring it. You can also have it rigged at the time we meet or we can rig the Skagit rod up when we need to. If you fish classic click a pawl reels, cool, so do I. If you're a beginner please have a reel with a drag.
